CEO REPORT

PETER SAUNDERS, ICMDA CEO

More people will seek help in a hospital or health clinic than will ever darken the door of a church. This gives Christian doctors and dentists a unique opportunity to bring the message and love of Jesus to many of those who would not otherwise experience it.

Luke, the first ever Christian doctor, tells us that Jesus sent out his disciples to preach the gospel and to heal the sick (Luke 9:2). He still does and there remains much to be done. We live in a desperately hurting world where many still lack access to good healthcare and many more have not yet heard the good news of Jesus Christ.

Currently, world-wide, there are 1.2 million medical students in 2,600 medical schools, 12 million doctors and 375,000 healthcare facilities including 84,000 hospitals. Furthermore, doctors and dentists have skills, resources and international access at a level unprecedented in world history.

Imagine if every person on earth had access to



a Christian doctor and dentist in their own community. This is the vision of ICMDA which exists to start and strengthen national Christian medical and dental movements throughout the world.

We now have 84 affiliated national movements. Twelve joined at the 16th World Congress in Hyderabad, India in 2018, including ten from Francophone countries and we are working for a further 16 to join at the next World

Congress in Tanzania in 2022.

During 2019, over 100 national and regional conferences and events took place with the aim of equipping and strengthening medical and dental leaders, especially those from resource and gospel poor countries.

ICMDA was at the forefront of this activity, encouraging prayer, delivering resources & training, and providing wisdom, experience and advice.

Last year we ran leaders' training events in Western Europe, Russia & Central Asia; South, East & South-East Asia; and West, East & Southern Africa.

Also, international conferences for Arabic, French, Portuguese and Spanish speaking doctors and dentists took place in Egypt, Burkina Faso, Mozambique and Guatemala. The work is expanding exponentially, and God is raising up more workers to support this vision.

On 1 February, 2019, I took the baton from Vinod Shah as CEO of ICMDA and the world office moved from Vellore, India to St Albans, UK. This was a challenging transition involving renting premises, hiring staff, setting up new office equipment & IT systems and establishing ICMDA as a UK registered company and charity. But by God's grace the move has gone very smoothly.

This has meant that I have been able to hit the ground running with 19 ministry trips to 18 countries throughout 2019. I have been overwhelmed by what God is doing in and through Christian doctors and dentists and pray that you too will be inspired and energised by the contents of this report.

Special thanks go to my wife Kirsty, my EA Josh, the ICMDA board and ICMDA UK Trust and our fantastic team of 43 fieldworkers who give so selflessly to the service and glory of our wonderful Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

FOCUS ON

SOUTH EAST ASIA

A dentist leaving a comfortable career to serve an unreached tribal group in the jungles; a Cambodian gangster-turned-surgeon serving the slums of Phnom Penh; a Swiss medical student catching God's heart for the nations through an elective in the Philippines – these were the people I met during my first exposure to the ministry of ICMDA in South East Asia. It was the inaugural South East Asia Medical Missions Conference (SEAMMC) in Bali, Indonesia in 2017. Doctors, dentists, students, and ministry partners representing every South East Asian nation were gathered to build kingdom friendships and walk together as God's family in a new season for South East Asia. **At this conference the little ember in my heart for missions began to roar to life.**

In January 2019 I had the privilege of joining student leaders in Australia for CMDFA's Vision



Leadership Conference. Together with friends from Malaysia and Indonesia, we learnt from the book of Daniel about being a faithful Christian witness and leader in a hostile culture. Over meals, late-night card games, and time at the sunny beaches, we shared testimonies about what God has been doing in our campuses and traded ideas for ministry.

In June 2019, I was invited to attend the ICMDA Younger Leaders' Training in Bali, where I met a passionate group of students and young

professionals who are being used by God to impact their campuses and nations. We reflected on the life of Nehemiah together, seeing the vision that God gave him and his leadership in rebuilding the walls of Jerusalem. As representatives from various nations shared both our praise reports and struggles, we cried out to the Lord to remind us of

the vision he had entrusted to us and to grant us the same wisdom and faithfulness that Nehemiah had to see it through to the end.

The new community I have found in ICMDA South East Asia has truly helped birth many new ideas, initiatives, and movements in my own medical school and in Singapore. Inspired by the impact of mentors in CMDFA, we are now piloting a student mentorship programme that connects clinical year students with Christian role models in their hospitals. Students with a passion for missions now gather with missionary doctors and dentists to be mentored. Since the first SEAMMC in 2017, God has spoken to us about his desire to stir up a fresh wave of missions among students in Singapore.

Students from the three medical schools came together to share God's heart for the nations and the inaugural Healthcare in Missions Conference (HIMC) was born in 2018. The first Saline

Process training for medical students in Singapore has taken place after inspiration from our Indonesian brothers and sisters, whose evangelistic vigour is testament to the impact of the training. We are now organising the inaugural Biblical Worldview Conference for students and doctors – inspired by the testimony of a South

African surgeon we met in Bali!

I truly thank God for the work of ICMDA: connecting God's people from different nations and sounding his call for us to walk as one family. As I reflect on the impact of ICMDA, I am asking the Lord to teach me what it means to walk together with his family from the nations. My earnest prayer is that when God calls on me to do so, I will gladly lay myself down to help my brothers and sisters in the nations fulfil their destiny in the Lord.

CMDF Singapore was formed in 1973 and became an ICMDA member after hosting the World Congress in 1975. The fellowship is currently led by Goh Siew Hor. www.cmdf.org.sg

CMDF Indonesia began through a student movement in 1979 and became an ICMDA member in 2002. They have more than 1,000 Christian doctors & dentists affiliated with them. The fellowship is led by Lineus Hewis. www.cmdfindonesia.or.id

SOUTH EAST ASIA

Indonesia and Singapore are the only ICMDA member groups in South East Asia, however, there are groups in six other countries that are looking to become affiliated with ICMDA at the next World Congress in Tanzania on 19-24 July 2022.

In Singapore, a small island nation of 6 million people, there are three medical schools. Though it is a densely populated land with over 9,000 people per sq km, it is also a strategic hub for mission activity.

Indonesia is the fourth most populous country in the world (270 million people) and has the largest Muslim population of any country. There are 83 medical schools and 30 dental schools with Christian student fellowships on 53 campuses.

Over 100 doctors have taken part in CMDF's three-month Medical Mission training course, equipping graduates for medical missions.

Please pray for CMDF Indonesia as they strive for his Kingdom in Indonesia through godly doctors and dentists who serve the Lord wholeheartedly.

GOD IS AT WORK

A REPORT FROM BEHIND CLOSED DOORS IN THE INDO-CHINA REGION

Five of us started meeting together in 2017 to study the Bible every two weeks aiming to grow in the Word and build each other up. We were invited to attend the SEAMMC conference in Bali later that year.

We saw the passion of believers sharing the gospel and bringing many to faith in their own countries.

The testimony and love of so many inspired us to form a Christian Medical Fellowship in our own country which led to our first retreat in February 2018. From the North and the South of the country 20 healthcare workers came together to meet each other for the first time and build friendship and unity. 30 of us met for a retreat in November 2019 to develop plans for service in the coming year under the slogan: Meeting Together for Christ to Live in the Light.

We want to share the gospel and have Christian medical fellowships in every province of the country. We dream of having a Christian hospital to serve the poor and sick and share the good news with them. Please pray for us that we would remain strong, and that the Lord would add to our number. We thank the Lord for encouraging us and fulfilling his purpose in us as we earnestly seek his will.

FIELDWORKER SUMMIT

6-11 OCTOBER 2019

It was a shock for many of our fieldworkers from warmer parts of the globe to arrive in St Albans on a typically cold and damp British day in October; but, by the end of a week together, the 30 ICMDA volunteers from 26 different countries were warmed by their fellowship together and had a much better understanding of their role in ICMDA's global mission.

'The warm fellowship of the brethren was indeed a foretaste of heaven,' said Alex, our East African Regional Secretary.

I'm in regular contact with all our regional volunteers throughout the year, but I hadn't met many of them in person. Spending a week together deepened our friendships, gave an insight into the many challenges and cultural differences from region to region, and highlighted the unity we all share through faith in the Lord Jesus Christ.



It is a joy to serve alongside such passionate doctors and dentists from Azerbaijan and Togo to Japan and Uruguay.

Each day began with a devotion led by one of our Regional Secretaries. On the first morning, Rick a Dutch thoracic surgeon and Regional Secretary for Eurasia, began the week by challenging us in our work and walk with the Lord to be more like thermostats than thermometers. In a world where truth is being redefined or rewritten, where doctors and dentists face challenges over their right to

practise medicine according to their conscience, and where kingdom values are being uprooted, we were challenged to stand up and speak up for what is right and just – to set the cultural temperature, not merely to reflect it.

As we spent time sharing about the challenges and opportunities we each have in our corner of the



harvest field it was so encouraging to see what God is doing among this fantastic group of people. It was great to have Khara join us from St Vincent & Grenadines in the Caribbean. She came as an observer, having recently graduated from Cave Hill Campus at the University of the West Indies in Barbados, where she was moved by the work of IFES in the Caribbean and wanted to see medical students better equipped to serve the Lord in their chosen fields. Having spent a week with us at the Summit, then attending the Sydenham 2 Conference in London and spending time with CMF UK, she has now accepted an invitation to serve as an ICMDA Regional Representative for the Anglophone Central America region – an area with 18 countries and territories that have English as an official language but where there are no Christian medical fellowships that we are aware of.



We are already seeing fruit from our time together, with many fieldworkers going back to their regions and contacting individuals in countries where there is no fellowship. In the two months following the Summit there are already reports of new groups in The Gambia and Senegal looking to join the ICMDA family!

Whether it was exploring the Christian heritage of Cambridge, discussing ICMDA's future strategy, praying together about the challenges we face personally and in our regions, or seeing afresh the unique opportunity doctors and dentists have to bring the healing message of Jesus to the world, the biennial summit was

a tiring week but so worth it.

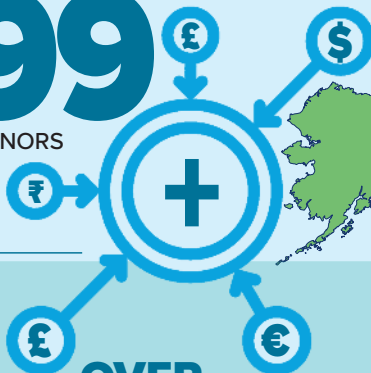

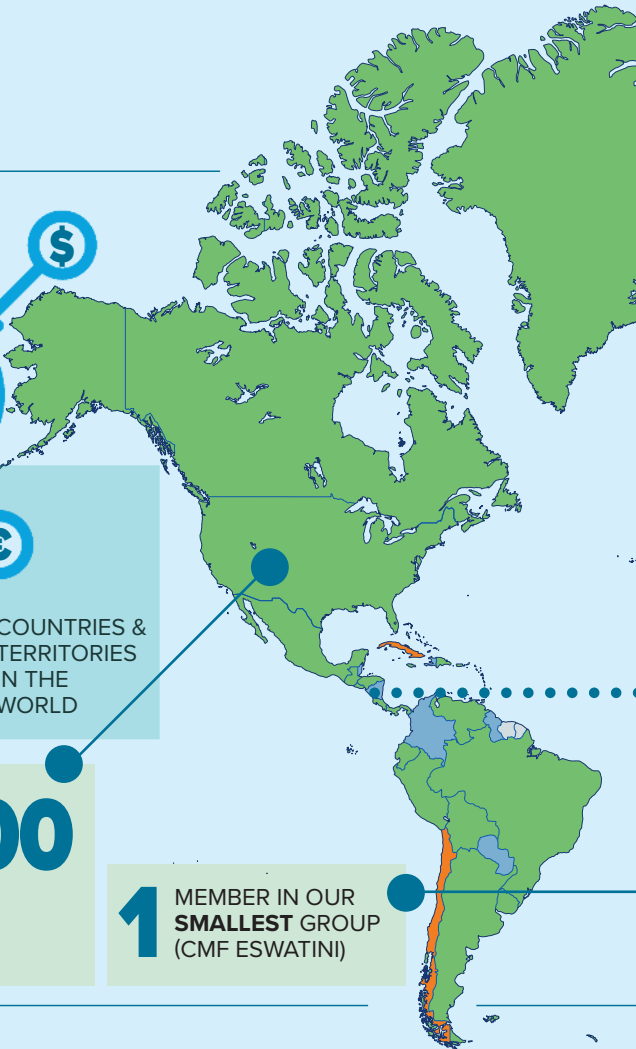

LANGUAGES

There are around 7,000 unique languages in the world spoken by its 7.8 billion people, from Hindi and Turkish to Rama and Liki. However, nearly all doctors and dentists will speak at least one of just seven major world languages: Arabic, English, French, Mandarin, Portuguese, Russian and Spanish. ICMDA is seeking to unite medics not just regionally but through shared languages too. In 2019 we held four language-based conferences with delegates attending from at least 40 different countries.

ICMDA Congress for French Speaking Doctors, Ouagadougou, Burkina Faso

‘This conference changed my vision as a Christian medical doctor. The teaching and contact with others showed me the urgent need to join together as Christian medics to impact our nation.’ – Barak from Chad.

200 participants from eleven Francophone countries gathered for a week of fellowship and training in the capital of Burkina Faso in August 2019.

Two Senegalese students, Christian and Rebecca, began thinking separately of ways to

start a Christian fellowship in their home country. Christian started a student prayer group and began interceding for the Lord to work among doctors in Senegal. Rebecca (in her seventh year of medicine) met with another group of experienced doctors to share her passion to start a fellowship. The Lord brought the two groups together and CMF Senegal was formed in January 2020.

ICMDA Congress for Spanish Speaking Doctors, Guatemala

In Nueva Guatemala de la Asunción, the capital city of Guatemala, 92 doctors, dentists and students met together at the start of their dry season for a world congress for Spanish speakers. With delegates from Chile, Peru, Uruguay, El Salvador, Panama, Mexico, Honduras and Guatemala, they focussed on the theme of postmodernism and healthcare. A highlight was the appointing of Dr Mario Ruiz as the new Regional Secretary for Central America with great enthusiasm and support for this position.

There are many challenges in the Spanish speaking world, particularly in Latin America – such as refugees, the drugs trade, corrupt politicians,

prosperity theology and marginalised indigenous populations – but Christian doctors and dentists are responding with courage and compassion even as secularism increases its international stranglehold. ICMDA is uniting and equipping Christians to act and speak boldly into our hurting world.

ICMDA Congress for Portuguese Speaking Doctors, Nampula, Mozambique

Three national groups from Mozambique, Brazil and Portugal organised a successful congress attended by 71 delegates from Cuba, Brazil, Portugal, UK, Netherlands, Guinea Bissau, Zimbabwe, Malawi, Mozambique, South Africa and Angola.

20 facilitators led Bible expositions, plenaries and workshops with support from PRIME, the Saline Process and NOURISH House for pre-conference training.

ICMDA board member Soraya, a paediatrician from Brazil, reports: 'The Congress exceeded our expectations. The opportunity to exchange experiences, training and fellowship will strengthen national movements and more Christian medical and dental movements will start around the Portuguese world.'

The congress was very good for me and I believe for my partner Amanucha, it served to renew the forces and walk on in the steps that we are already taking in our country regarding the union, monitoring and strengthening for health professionals.

During the congress I realised that God is working in Guinea-Bissau through us - as he is doing all over the world - and it encouraged me to move forward as I discovered that we were not alone in this vision. The topics covered (abortion, depression, suicide etc) are challenges we face daily in services, so the lectures gave me more tools to deal with these situations. Encouraging the practice of witnessing for Christ through our profession was very good.

TRAINING

During ICMDA CEO Peter Saunders' time at CMF UK, he helped develop a training programme for international students and junior doctors called Sydenham, named after the English Hippocrates, Thomas Sydenham (1624-1689). Based in London, UK, the course is an intensive training week aiming to equip and inspire potential future leaders to live faithfully as Christians in medicine. ICMDA has benefitted from the success of Sydenham as many of our current fieldworkers are alumni of the course.

In 2019 ICMDA has sought to replicate the success of this programme by hosting our own leadership training events in three of our world regions: South East Asia, East Africa and Southern Africa. At each event key students and young doctors, all showing leadership potential, were invited to attend lectures and seminars on topics such as medical ethics, student ministry,



evangelism, global health and mission, leadership principles, calling and stewardship and the power of prayer.

In 1 Chronicles 12:32 it recalls those who stood with King David in his battles, including some from the tribe of Issachar – they were the smallest in number of all the tribes listed, but it is said they understood the times and knew what Israel should do. The Sydenham course aims to foster the same wise attitude among medics in the 21st century – equipping young doctors and dentists to see the world with spiritual

eyes through the challenges they face – to understand the times we live in and to recognise the needs, trials and opportunities that serving the Lord through healthcare presents.

COMMUNICATION

Communicating the vision of ICMDA has been one of our key priorities in 2019. Whether it's using online media, mobile technology, up-front reports at conferences or equipping our fieldworkers with resources, we've aimed to have a clear and consistent message of what our ministry with Christian doctors and dentists is all about.

We have completely redesigned our website, **www.icmda.net**, to be a shop window into the vision and mission of ICMDA. Visitors are familiarised with the regions of the world where we work and are introduced to our fieldworkers and volunteers. There are many resources available: training videos, devotionals, teaching series and online books. Work has begun on the translation of publications into the seven major world languages; many of our video resources have already had subtitles in seven major languages completed.



In the developing world, quality resources in a local language are greatly needed. Within ICMDA there are many mature and well-established national groups that have produced excellent publications that are now making these available for translation. We aim to translate and publish many more of these resources and distribute them as widely as possible to those parts of the world that need them most.

Every two months we produce a prayer diary that informs

readers about our global work and highlights the activities in which our affiliated national movements and fieldworkers are involved. These prayer points are spread around the world via social media and various WhatsApp groups. We have translation teams converting the information into French, Spanish, Portuguese, Russian and Korean ensuring the fuel for prayer goes as widely as possible.

GOVERNANCE

SOME PERSONAL REFLECTIONS FROM DR ELMER THIESSEN, CANADIAN DENTIST AND CHAIR OF THE ICMDA INTERNATIONAL BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The International Board stays connected to the ongoing management and operations of ICMDA through my personal contacts with our CEO Peter Saunders, regular 'Zoom' Executive meetings, and our annual face-to-face Board meeting. As chairperson, I have had the privilege of attending meetings across the world. Shirley, my wife, has joined me in all these travels. We are blessed with good health, a great marriage, and a love of other cultures.

2019 began with the CEO transition from Vinod Shah to Peter Saunders, from the office in Vellore, India to the present location in St Albans, UK. We continue to praise God and thank Vinod for the growth and health of ICMDA's ministry under his leadership. With an effective handover in late January, Peter



was able to hit the ground running. Peter, together with his assistant, Josh Mills, has continued to advance the ministry of ICMDA remarkably. A major challenge we faced was the changes to our operating and ministry budget. The UK financial circumstances are a huge adjustment from India. We are therefore dependent on extra donations to subsidise the field ministry over and above the income from national subscriptions.

In March, I participated in the ICMDA (UK) Trust meeting in St Albans, UK. The Trust is currently transitioning to a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) in order to accommodate our operation in the United Kingdom. Shirley and I were privileged to be hosted by Kevin and Sheila Vaughan in St Albans (Kevin was the ICMDA chair prior to my term).

Following my time in the UK, we travelled to Kiev, Ukraine for the Eurasia Committee meeting organised by our Regional Secretary, Rick Paul. The time of fellowship, mutual encouragement, training and strategising with fieldworkers throughout Eurasia was beneficial and rewarding.

The hospitality we experienced, as a board, at the face-to-face meetings in Bali, Indonesia in June was outstanding. The local committee was amazing, and it was wonderful to be in Hedwin's (one of our three AEOs) part of the world.

Having our board meetings dovetail with the South East Asia training conference had many ministry and relational benefits and as a board we were encouraged and inspired by the priorities and strategies outlined by Peter Saunders.

The board will continue to shape and influence direction through the work of three subcommittees: governance, strategic planning, and finance. Our fellowship together was greatly enhanced through



the terrific tours and sightseeing arranged by the host committee.

The ICMDA Fieldworker Summit was held in St Albans, UK and hosted by Peter Saunders' home church, Spicer Street. Spicer Street provided the meeting room, the meals, and much of the billeting – we are very grateful for the wonderful hospitality. Shirley and I were again privileged to stay with Kevin and Sheila along with Alex Bolek, the Regional Secretary for East Africa. The Summit programme of teaching, planning, sharing, worship and prayer was amazing.

Our trips to Cambridge, the UK CMF offices in London, and the walking tour of Central London were very enriching. Thanks to the Lord and our hosts for a very meaningful and fruitful week.

FINANCE

From 2011 to 2018 ICMDA's central office was based in Vellore, India under the leadership of Dr Vinod Shah. In February 2019, Peter Saunders began his position as the new Chief Executive, and the ICMDA office was moved to St Albans, UK. 2019 was a year of transition and there have been costs involved with setting up the office, purchasing equipment and ensuring the ICMDA (UK) Trust charity was a suitable vehicle to operate from. We are in the process of converting the trust to a more robust Charitable Incorporated Organisation.

Overheads, salaries and administrative costs are higher in comparison to operating from India so in this transition year we anticipated running a deficit as we sought to increase income through donations and other giving.

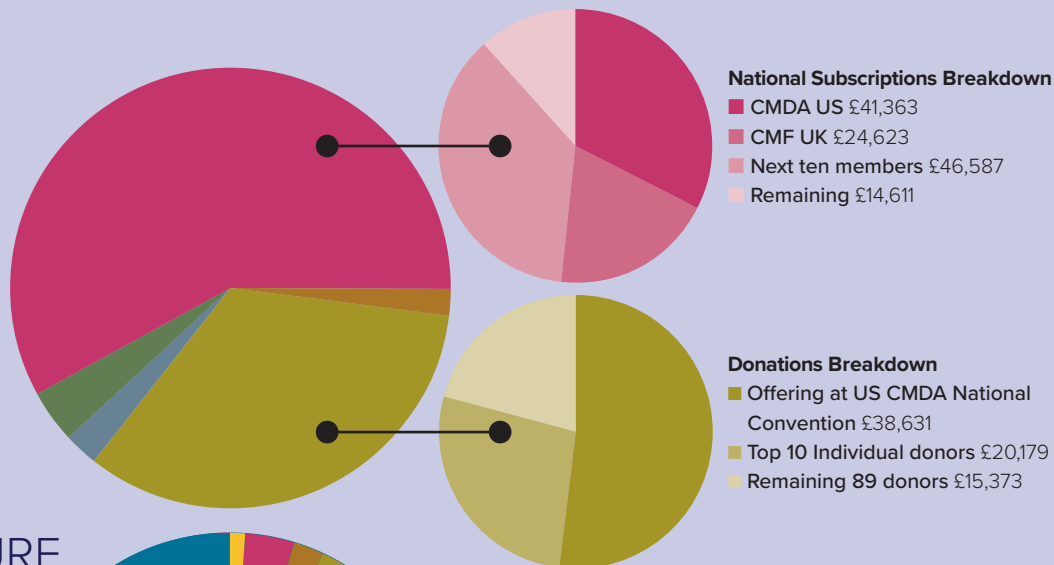


We have been blessed by the response of UK and US doctors in particular in their generosity in supporting the work of ICMDA. Each national movement pays a subscription to ICMDA in proportion to their size and GNI. 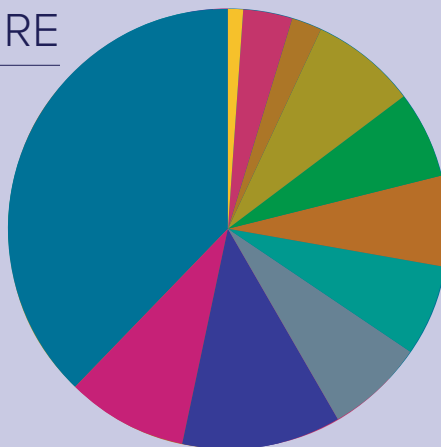
