
Introduction


Introduction

- Definitions:-
 - Council of Europe (CoE) doesn't define
 - United Nations (UN) is specific regarding severity and perpetrator, and excludes corporal & capital punishment
- ○International Humanitarian Law (IHL):-
 - National legislation eg UK's Human Rights Act
 - CoE: European Convention of Human Rights (ECHR): Article 3
 - UN: Convention Against Torture (CAT)
- Types:-
 - Torture:-

 - Physical
 - Psychological
 - Sexual
 - Wider ill-treatment
- Response:-
 - Depends upon your location and skill set


