





Why Care for Internationals?

God has special concern for foreigners, orphans and widows

- <u>Ps 146:9</u> The LORD watches over the foreigner and sustains the fatherless and the widow
- Jer 7:6-7 If you do not oppress the foreigner, the fatherless or the widow ... then I will let you live in this place, in the land I gave your ancestors
- <u>Zech 7:10 -</u> Do not oppress the widow or the fatherless, the foreigner or the poor.

Why Care for Internationals? God does and commands us to do so!

- Lev 19:34 The foreigner residing among you must be treated as your native-born. Love them as yourself, for you were foreigners in Egypt. I am the LORD your God.
- <u>Deut 10:18-19</u> He defends the cause of the fatherless and the widow, and loves the foreigner residing among you, giving them food and clothing. ¹⁹ And you are to love those who are foreigners

Why Care for Internationals?

God wants them to know Him!

- Deut 31:12 Assemble the people—men, women and children, and the foreigners residing in your towns—so they can listen and learn to fear the LORD your God
- Mt 28:19 Go and make disciples of all nations
- <u>Rev 5:9</u> With your blood you purchased for God persons from every tribe and language and people and nation.

Why Care for Internationals?

We are foreigners!

- Eph 2:12 Remember ... you were separate from Christ, excluded from citizenship in Israel and foreigners to the covenants of the promise, without hope and without God in the world.
- Heb 11:13 All these people were still living by faith when they died. They did not receive the things promised; they only saw them and welcomed them from a distance, admitting that they were foreigners and strangers on earth.
- <u>1 Peter 1:17</u> live out your time as foreigners here in reverent fear.

How Can I Meet Internationals?

Look around you at work! Look around your neighborhood Local schools and colleges Local churches with ethnic congregations or ministries Ethnic restaurants and stores Through volunteering at ministries of service

Essential Preparation and Empowerment

- Ask God to reveal to you who He wants you to befriend or reach out to
- Pray regularly and persistently for wisdom and for God to draw them
- Boldly step out of your comfort zone to get to know them and their hopes and needs

Ways to Bless Internationals

Modeling the love & compassion of Jesus

- Friendships and time together
- Language practice/classes
- Tutoring children
- Practical help using appliances, obtaining bank account, drivers license, learning to use the bus, etc.
- Explain holidays and customs
- Share scripture in their language

Volunteer Opportunities

 Local church programs
 Classes in local language
 Food banks
