Jachin & Frikkie on Promoting Family Medicine Worldwide

1. Anonymous: Does the program offer a valid medical degree? Is there world-wide, accreditation or certification?
2. Anonymous: Would you mind defining what exactly makes the programme international, if the context is mostly Indian?
3. Anonymous: If contact centres are outside the region, have visa difficulties been considered? How would these constraints be handled talking about the face-to-face contact?
4. Thim: Now I live in poor conditions, how could I get scholarship?
5. Peter: I have a bachelor's degree in public health, I would like to ask if I can apply for family medicine? If yes, is there any scholarship to support an international applicant.
6. Bruce: Twenty African church hospitals have university-based Master of Medicine - Family Medicine or regionally accredited (West African College of Physicians) in a three/four year, full residencies that emphasize leadership and educational competencies to expand the training capacities in at least five countries through the auspices of Christian Academy of African Physicians (caaphome.org). What opportunities might be considered for collaboration with these programs and the Diploma program?
7. Anonymous: Can a family medical specialist with masters still apply for this course to get experience in Christian content?
8. Bruce: Has the Vellore Family Medicine full residency accepted "lateral entry" of Diploma graduates? CAAP would like to learn more about that.
