
Moldova Meanderings


It was a real joy to meet with national leaders and fieldworkers of the ICMDA Eurasia region for their leaders' conference in Chisinau, Moldova on 21-25 March. The conference was organised by local Area Representative Ruslan Ridcodubschi, led by Eurasia Regional Secretary Noel Aruparayil and hosted by the Emanuel Centre clinic in the city, which is also the base of the Emmanuel Christian Medical Society of Moldova which formally joined ICMDA as a full national member last year. The 18 conference attendees came from twelve countries including Moldova, Russia, Ukraine, Belarus, Azerbaijan, Armenia,



The conference theme was 'Tapestry of Love' based on the Message Version translation of Colossians 2:2-4 ('I want you woven into a tapestry of love in touch with everything there is to know of God'). As well as enjoying great teaching, fellowship and worship together we also visited a vineyard (Moldova is famous for its wine) and were treated to a concert put on by Emmanuel Centre staff and a performance of La Traviata at the Moldova opera house.

Jesus said that the love of Christians for one another, and their unity, would be a powerful testimony to the truth of the gospel (John 13:34,35; 17:21) and it was wonderful to see a team from countries that have been (or are still) at war with one another celebrating their unity in Christ together and growing in their love for one another across national divides.






Early morning on Tuesday 2 April I flew overnight from Kigali (see above) with

Santhosh Mathew (ICMDA head of training) via Ethiopia to Lomé, the capital of Togo in Francophone West Africa. Togo is home to 9 million people and is a former French colony wedged between Ghana and Benin. It was earlier a major centre for the slave trade. We were met by Jean Paul Dansou, Togolese radiologist and ICMDA regional secretary for Francophone Africa. After a restful night enjoying the wonderful hospitality of Jean Paul and his family we picked up our area representative (AR) Sofako Egloh in Lomé and drove the ten-hour 560 km journey north to <u>Hope Hospital</u>, <u>Mango</u> (Hôpital De L'espérance) - no mean feat in 40 degree heat but the fellowship was even warmer! The 65-bed hospital was opened by <u>ABWE</u> in 2015 and now has a bustling 12-

operating theatres and an obstetric department doing 1,500 deliveries per year. The senior staff are mainly from the US and France but there were also three Togolese doctors plus two African surgical residents being trained as part of the PAACS programme (Pan African Academy of Christian Surgeons). The purpose of our visit was to assess the hospital as a potential base for our diploma of family medicine programme (I-PGDFM) which we plan to launch

in French next year. We have already trained (or are currently training) 190 doctors from over 50 countries in English using the two-year programme. Our impressions of the hospital were excellent and we were very warmly received. Watch this space. In the next few months we will be making similar visits to assess hospitals in Central Asia and Central America for our Russian and Spanish programmes, also due to launch in 2025.


